ANNUAL FUND FOR EXCELLENCE

JULY 1, 2018–JUNE 30, 2019

The 2018-2019 Development Campaign was a success as we continued our efforts in building community. Through engagement events as well as fundraising initiatives, together we gave our time, talent, and treasure to ensure our students become their best selves.

The Annual Fund for Excellence represents our most important whole community year-long philanthropic endeavor. All families are contacted about the Annual Fund for Excellence with the hope that each family will participate. Our collective effort raises funds to help offset the gap between tuition and the cost of providing for our children's education for the current school year. Tuition covers 83% of our operating budget. The Annual Fund for Excellence, along with other generated revenue streams, helps offset the remaining 17%.

The Annual Fund for Excellence facilitates a well-rounded program that includes exceptional academic courses of study, outstanding fine arts and athletic offerings,

and essential professional development opportunities for faculty and staff. It also diminishes the need for withdrawals from the endowment fund, augments financial aid, keeps tuition affordable, and maintains an enviable student/teacher ratio.

We kicked off the school year with the school-wide "Circles of Conversation" engagement event, as our community of parents, faculty, staff, administrators, and board members joined to network and discuss our efforts for a successful school year.

Our fundraising activities during the 2018-2019 Development Campaign focused on The Annual Fund for Excellence and Holy Trinity's Fall and Spring event initiatives: The Wayne K. Curry Memorial Golf Classic and Sponsored Spelling. Monies raised targeted the learning needs of our students regarding enrichment activities, resources for science and technology, and professional development for our faculty and staff.

We are pleased to report that our community of families, friends, corporate sponsors, and donors contributed \$83,800 to Holy Trinity: An Episcopal School's 2018-2019 Development Campaign. The results of the specific initiatives were: The Annual Fund for Excellence = \$48,500; The Wayne K. Curry Memorial Golf Classic, Wine Tasting & Silent Auction = \$6,900; and Sponsored Spelling = \$28,400. Philanthropic gifts were received by cash, check and credit card, as well as through matching employer contributions and charitable campaigns such as United Way and Combined Federal Campaign.



BUILDING OUR COMMUNITY:

CIRCLES OF CONVERSATION

A big element of Holy Trinity's community is the foundation of communication among students, parents, and the school. As we are three divisions, two campuses, and one school, we are THE COMMUNITY. This is the focus of the "Circles of Conversation" initiative. It is a continuous series of engagement events coordinated throughout the school year centered on bringing Holy Trinity families together to build community and support networks among each other.

The school year began with a campus wide "Circles of Conversation" hosted on the basketball courts of the Daisy Lane campus. The event featured heavy hors d'oeuvres catered by Chef Steven of Minute Events Catering, beverages by Potomac Gourmet, and music by DJ Corey Matthews.

In response to the needs of our community, Holy Trinity hosted a "Circles of Conversation" in January 2019 in support of our families affected by the government furlough. Chef Steven of Minute Events Catering donated the wonderful meal and shared his uplifting testimony of how he started his company during a time of furlough in his career. Chef also donated hot lunch for students of government employees who registered for the opportunity. Others of the Holy Trinity community donated Chick-Fil-A lunches for those same students.



In our Circles of Conversation, this is where our community is most strong. Together, we empower each other to provide a network and environment that supports the development of the whole child.

SPONSORED SPELLING



First-grader Ezra Wymes (above left) raised the most money in our Sponsored Spelling competition—\$1,320. The Daisy Lane School participated in Sponsored Spelling for the first time in order to raise funds for their playground (above right).

Holy Trinity's Spring 2019 Sponsored Spelling was a great success. Collectively the goal was set to raise \$30,000. In addition to the traditional event, the Kindergarteners of The Daisy Lane School participated in Sponsored Spelling, focusing on 10 key sight words. All funds raised for The Daisy Lane School campaign focused on the need to remove the wood carpet and install rubber surfacing on The Daisy Lane School playground. Our goal was to raise \$5,000 towards this effort. The Daisy Lane School raised \$4,370 and the collective campaign raised \$28,400.

Sponsored Spelling is like a Spelling Bee except that it is completed on paper. Students received vocabulary lists assigned by their Language Arts teachers, and the complexity and number of words varied by grade levels. First through eighth grade students with the support of their parents/guardians studied their lists to prepare for the Sponsored Spelling test held on March 22nd. Parents and students solicited their family, friends and community for sponsorship pledges based upon the number of words the student would spell correctly from their assigned vocabulary list. Teachers provided the test results and

parents and/or students collected their donations based upon their pledge commitments.

Facebook, Twitter, text, and email options allowed us to reach our extended communities: parents, family, friends, colleagues and the like supported our students. Sponsored Spelling incentives for those who raised \$250 or more were as follows: 1st through 8th grade students received a \$75 Amazon gift card and Kindergarteners received a \$25 Barnes & Noble gift card. Homeroom classes that raised \$1,000 or more received a pizza party. Congratulations again to the 69 students and 7 classes that met or surpassed their incentives.

We also want to congratulate and thank Ezra Wymes—1st grade, who raised \$1,320, the most during our campaign. This was a family effort! Ezra's older brother Ellis Wymes—2nd grade helped Ezra study his vocabulary words, while Ezra's parents, Chekeim and Erika Wymes, reached out to extended family. Being a great steward of his support, Ezra followed up the Sponsored Spelling campaign by sending a thank you video to his family and friends. We want to thank Ezra and the Wymes family for ALL their support; it has made a huge impact in our efforts!

Honoring a Legacy—Promoting the Future



A life-long resident of Prince George's County, Wayne K. Curry made history in 1994, becoming the first African American ever elected County Executive for Prince George's County. A critical element of Wayne's efforts as County Executive focused on economic development by leveling the field of opportunity for today's labor force. In today's workforce this is ever more present, especially in science and technology.

Holy Trinity, like the legacy of Wayne Curry, shares in the desire to support economic development and building community throughout Prince George's county and the region. Both the School and Curry family understand that this starts with a strong academic foundation, supported by experiences that develop the creative, collaborative, communication and critical thinking, skills required of the 21st century.

Mr. & Mrs. Curry chose Holy Trinity for their children, Julian (class of 2008) and Taylor (class of 2010). Both students excelled academically and were very much part of student life at Holy Trinity.

To honor the legacy of Wayne Curry's work and to promote the future of our youth, Holy Trinity collaborated with the Curry family to establish the Wayne K. Curry Memorial Golf Classic. The fundraising effort of the event is to raise resources for Holy Trinity's science and technology programs.

We want to thank all our corporate sponsors, players, families and friends who have supported our students. We also want to thank former County Executive Rushern Baker for his support.

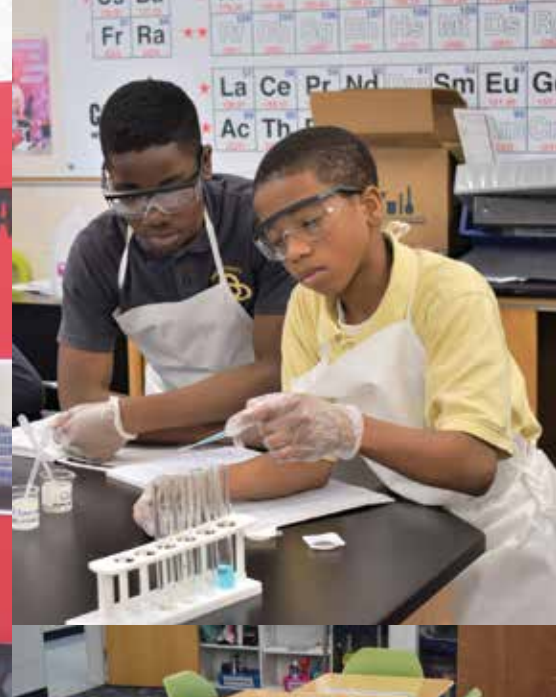

During the 2018 golf tournament, we gave special thanks to the Tyler family who in honor of the late Mr. Hubert Tyler made a \$1,000 donation toward STEM resources for the Holy Trinity Robotics Program. Collectively the fundraising events have raised \$18,450 resulting in enhancements for our science and technology programs.
